



Training Activities to implement the Data Protection Reform

TAtODPR is a European Research project to devise specialized, multidisciplinary, need-based training activities for professional Data Protection Officers in Europe.

TAtODPR delivers 3 specialized courses for the training of professional DPOs: one held in Naples, hosted by Università degli Studi Suor Orsola Benincasa, one in Spain, hosted by Universidad de Sevilla, and one in the United Kingdom, hosted by the University of Derby

Each course will be based on 3 major training modules, strongly intertwined with each other:



Legal Module, with a focus on providing knowledge about the legal framework for data protection



Technical, organizational and Impact Assessment Module, targeting technical aspects of data creation, management, storing, as well as the ability to devise data management strategies and evaluate the impact of policies



Behavioural and Security Module, aimed at allowing participants to understand the impact of data in the behaviour of a given organization, and to acquire the ability to manage the security-related aspects involved

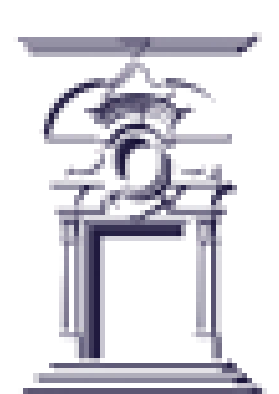
